The bishop has entrusted me with the responsibility of a parish covering a geographical area home to about one thousand people. My responsibility is to perform pastoral duties and introduce various programs such as community self-help groups, youth camps, and introducing income generating projects. I also work at mobilizing resources in the parish to help the needy and assist the elderly. I am the President of FADAEM, a community based organization (CBO) that campaigns against violence, female genital mutilation and early marriage. This has had a great impact on the Maasai pastoralist community in Kenya.

Our organization has a number of goals. We have had a great impact on our community. Our program is called Diocesan Missionary Aid (D.M.A.). It focuses on the well-being of rural communities through the establishment of health facilities. We also have a school for orphans of those affected or infected by H.I.V. and AIDS. Our courses in computer learning also introduce our rural communities to access to the virtual global village. We have also introduced poverty eradication programs which are particularly important as we sometime experiences long periods of droughts. Lastly, we have started a program to teach people about environmental conservation and climate change.

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
