Prisoners Rehabilitation And Welfare Action (PRAWA), Nigeria

My work at PRAWA involves direct interventions with our beneficiaries. I coordinate youth outreach through the Illegal Migration Awareness Project, which is currently working with secondary school students to build their capacity to train their fellow students on human rights. I am currently providing sanitary material for women in prison through the Live Clean in Prison campaign. Part of my work also involves daily management of the human resources portfolio in the organization.

PRAWA was set up in December 1994 to promote institutional reforms in the formal and informal sectors for access to justice, rehabilitation and social development of prisoners, ex-prisoners, torture victims and youths at risk. We work to promote safe societies where persons are empowered to reduce crime, offending behaviour, and torture. We also conduct research and raise awareness about gaps in upholding rights and the effects of practice and policy implementation in the justice and security sectors. PRAWA works in six African countries: Nigeria, Kenya, Zambia, Burundi, Democratic Republic of Congo and Rwanda.
